

Winner Retirement Center, L.L.C. dba Golden Prairie Manor RESIDENT RIGHTS

It is the responsibility of Golden Prairie Manor to inform the resident of his/her rights, prior to or at the time of admission, both orally and in writing, and of the rules governing the resident's conduct and responsibilities while living in this facility. We will notify you, both orally and in writing, of any changes in this document.

The following is a list of your rights:

- ◆ **Right to exercise your rights as a resident of the facility and as a citizen of the United States.**
- ◆ **Right to be free from interference, coercion, discrimination, and reprisal from the facility in exercising your rights.**
- ◆ **Right to have a person appointed to act on your behalf.** If you have been adjudged incompetent or incapacitated, your rights are exercised by the person appointed under state law to act on your behalf. When you have not been adjudged to be incompetent or incapacitated, your rights may be exercised by the legal surrogate recognized under state law, whether statutory or as recognized by the courts of the state to act on your behalf. We must record and keep up-to-date the appointed person's address and phone number.
- ◆ **Right to your records pertaining to you.** You may purchase photocopies of your records or any portions of them. The cost to you may not exceed community standards for photocopying and must provide the photocopies within 2 working days after the request.
- ◆ **Right to be fully informed of your total health status, including functional status, medical care, nursing care, nutritional status, rehabilitation, and restorative potential, activities potential, cognitive status, oral health, psychosocial status, and sensory and physical impairment.**
- ◆ **Right to refuse treatment and to refuse to participate in experimental research.** Your right to refuse treatment does not absolve the facility from responsibility to provide for necessary medical services and treatment. If you refuse treatment, we must inform you of the results of that refusal, plus any alternatives that may be available.
- ◆ **Right to formulate durable power of attorney for health care as provided in SDCL chapter 59-7 and a living will declaration as provided in SDCL chapter 34-12D.**
- ◆ **Right to receive visitors.** We encourage the visiting of residents by friends and relatives during the hours of 8:00am – 10:00PM. Visitors outside of this timeframe should be reported to staff.
- ◆ **Right of notification when A RESIDENT'S CONDITION CHANGES.** Right to have access to adequate and appropriate health care and health care providers of the resident's own choosing. The resident has the right to be fully informed in advance about care and treatment, and of any changes in the care and/or treatment that may affect the resident's well being. If the resident has been adjudged incompetent or otherwise found to be incapacitated under the laws of the state, he/she may also participate in planning care and treatment or changes in care and/or treatment. Also, the resident has the right to be immediately informed, along with your physician, and if known, notify the resident's legal representative or interested family member when any of the following occurs: an accident involving the resident, a significant change in the resident's physical, mental, or psychosocial status, a need to alter treatment significantly, a change in the

resident's room or roommate assignment, or a decision to transfer or discharge the resident from the facility.

- ◆ **Right to participate in all aspects of developing, providing, and changing the service plan.**
- ◆ **Right to manage his/her own money.** The facility WILL NOT manage the resident's personal funds.
- ◆ **Right to be treated with consideration and respect for personal dignity, individuality, and privacy.** Privacy shall include privacy in the resident's own room, including the right to close the door at any time, privacy in bathing and toileting (unless this poses a threat to the safety of the resident), privacy in a health or health-related examination or consultation; and privacy in maintaining personal possessions, including the right to keep at least one locked drawer or cabinet.
- ◆ **Right to engage in private communication.** This shall include receiving and sending unopened correspondence, with access to a telephone or having a private telephone at personal expense, and visiting with persons of the resident's choice without being overheard.
- ◆ **Right to visit a spouse or share a unit/apartment with his or her spouse if both are living in the assisted living facility.**
- ◆ **Right to exercise civil, social, and religious liberties.**
- ◆ **Right to receive meals consistent with religious or health-related restrictions.**
- ◆ **Right to participate in and benefit from community services and activities to achieve the highest possible level of independent, autonomy and interaction with the community.** Activities shall include opportunities to exercise and to go outdoors at regular, frequent intervals, weather permitting.
- ◆ **Right to have his or her records treated confidentially and to have reasonable access to those records.** To approve or release personal and medical records to an individual outside the facility or when the release of the records is required by law. With the resident's permission, a facility must allow the state inspectors or ombudsman or a representative or the ombudsman access to the resident's medical records.
- ◆ **Right to retire and rise according to the resident's wishes, as long as the resident does not disturb other residents.**
- ◆ **Right to live in a safe, comfortable, and sanitary environment.**
- ◆ **Right to be free from physical and chemical restraints unless authorized by a physician for a specified period of time in accordance with documented medical need and regulations pertaining to the application of restraints, or in the case of an emergency.**
- ◆ **Right to be free from abuse, neglect, or exploitation.**
- ◆ **Right to possess and use personal clothing and other personal property, unless the facility can demonstrate that the possession of use of the certain personal property would be unsafe or an infringement of the rights of others.**
- ◆ **Right to present grievances to the facility and to recommend changes in the facility's policies, procedures or services.**
- ◆ **Right to self-administer medications, unless specifically provided otherwise in the service plan.**
- ◆ **Right to have access to and participate in advocacy or special interest groups.**
- ◆ **Right to participate in or refrain from participating in adjudicatory proceedings held under existing state law governing the facility.** This shall occur at the resident's own expense unless stated otherwise in the resident's service contract.
- ◆ **Right to receive prior notice of relocation of the facility or the facility's intent to terminate the resident's contract.**
